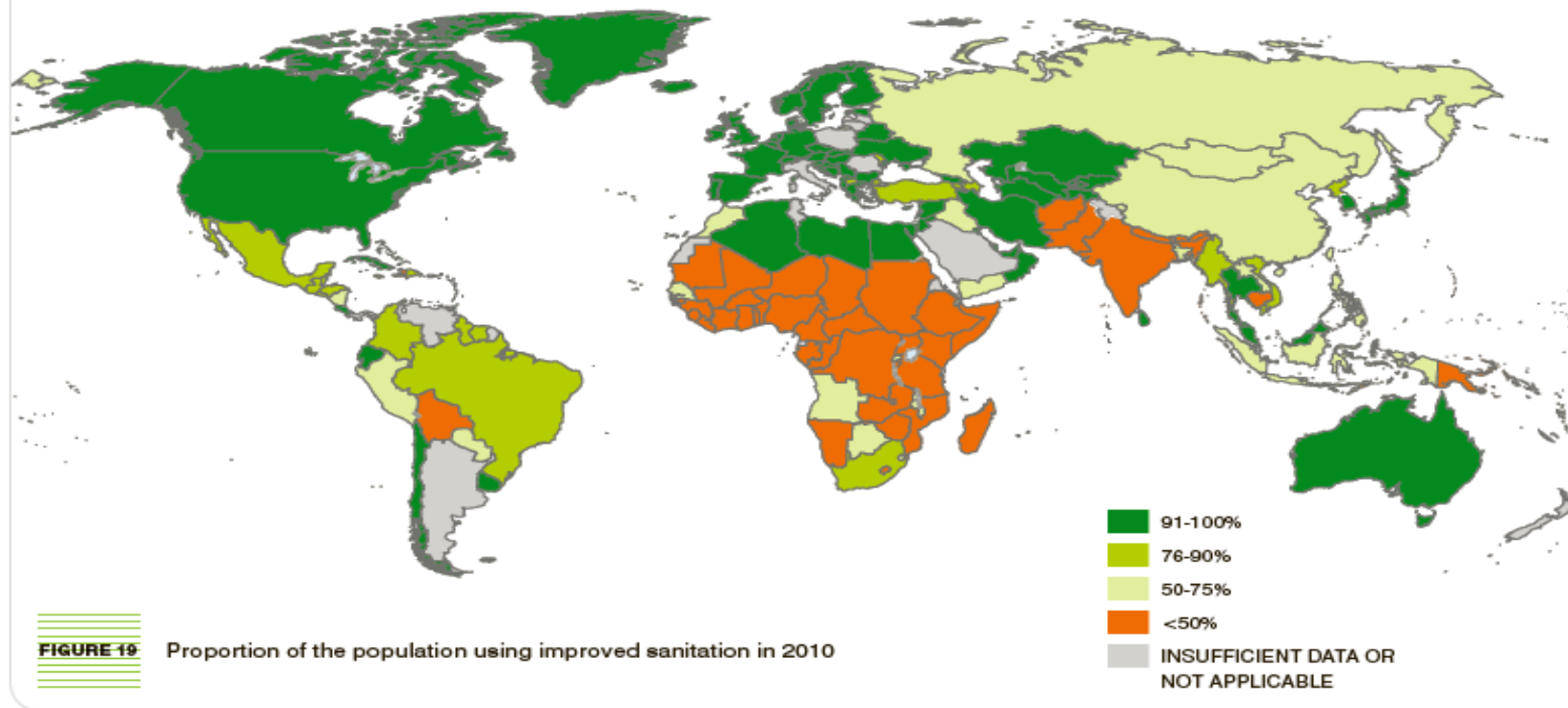

Recommendations



1. Strengthen political leadership through advocacy based on evidence
2. Craft national strategies that respond to needs on the ground
3. Strengthen leadership and accountability for water supply, sanitation, and hygiene
4. Maximize and leverage on the potential of NGOs and private sector

Recommendations



5. Create an enabling environment for developing entrepreneurship of local private sector and small-scale water and sanitation service providers
6. Encourage collaboration among multi-stakeholders from across disciplines, regions, and schools of thought need to be involved
7. Share lessons learned and utilize those to improve interventions

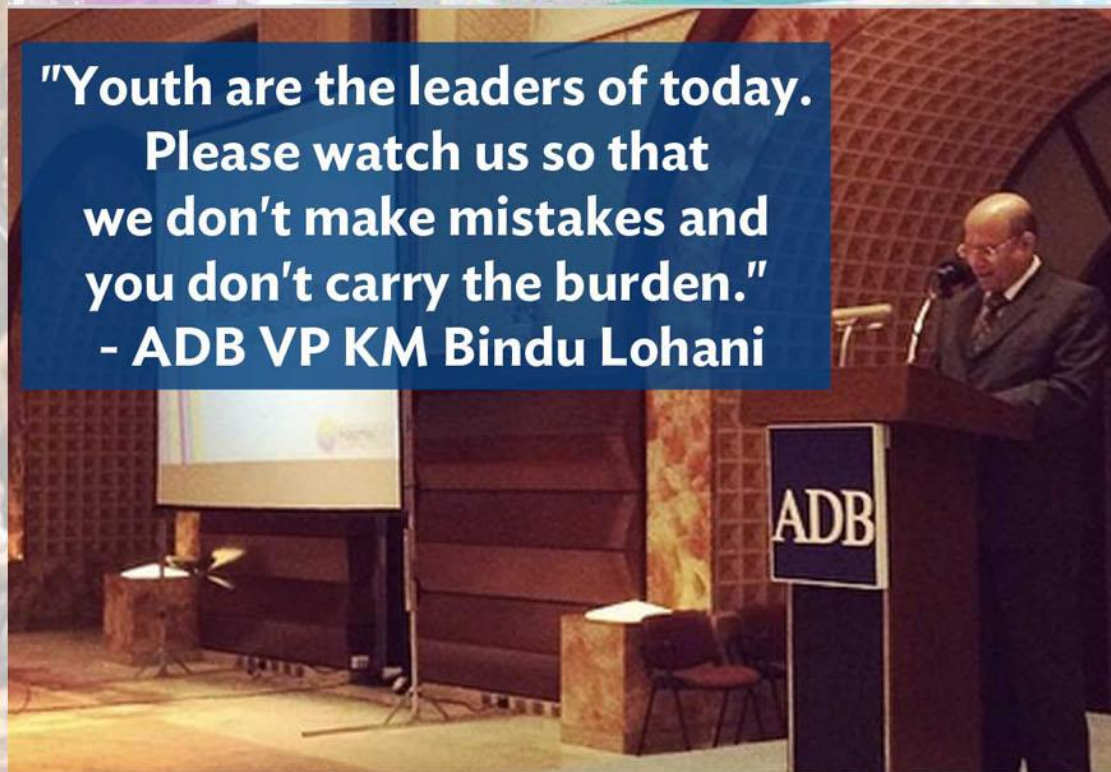

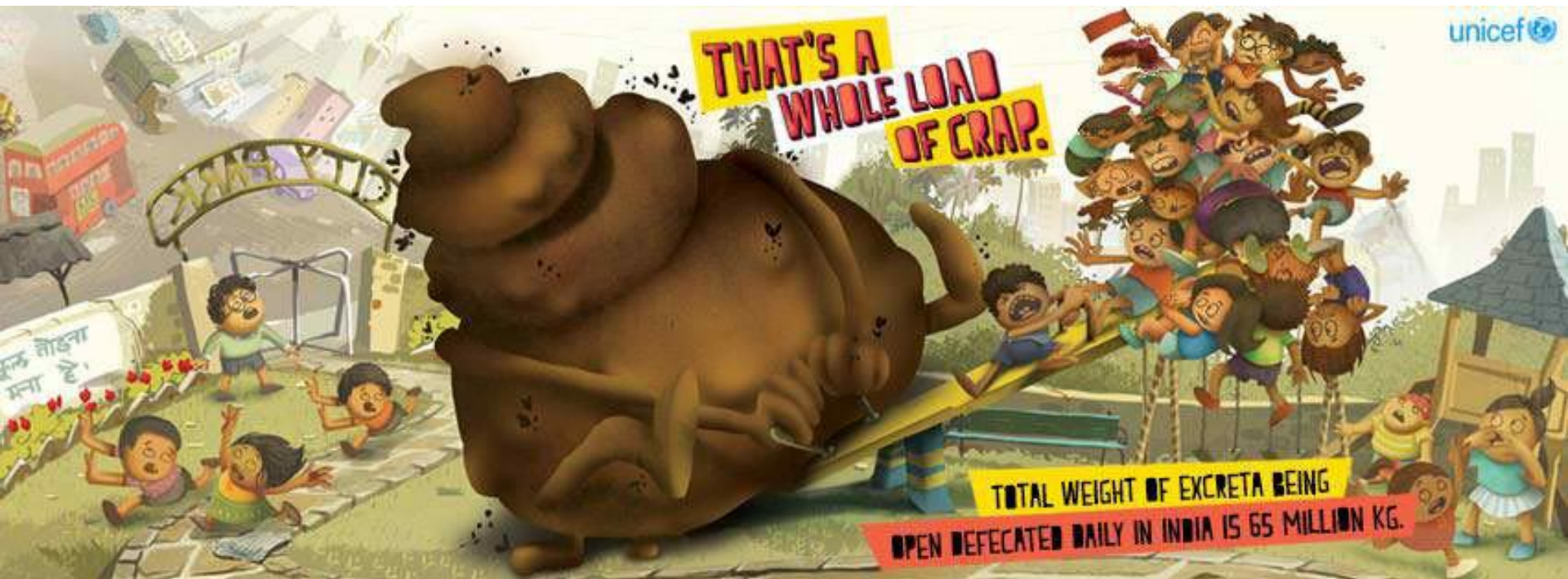
